

Who can attend?

Camp Kesem serves children who have lost a parent to cancer, have a parent undergoing cancer treatment, or whose parent is a cancer survivor—an estimated population of over 5 million children in the United States.

What age children attend camp? Camp Kesem serves children ages 6 to 18.

How long are the camps? The camps are typically one week in length.

How much does camp cost?

Camp Kesem is completely free of charge to all children who attend.

Who runs the camps? Our camps are staffed by highly trained college student leaders. These students are carefully screened through a competitive interview process, and undergo extensive training prior to camp. In addition, our student leaders work year-round to raise funds, conduct outreach in their communities, and plan the programming necessary to make camp a truly unique and unforgettable experience. Each camp is also staffed with nursing and mental health professionals.

Can children return to Camp Kesem more than once? Yes! Kesem campers are part of our family for life. Our campers love the bonds they form with friends who return year after year.

Does Camp Kesem provide therapy? No. Our student leaders provide a warm and loving environment where children are free to share their feelings with one another. Our model focuses on providing a strong peer-based support network where children can find strength, hope, compassion and fun.

Kesem's flagship program, Camp Kesem operates more than 130 free summer camps across the country for children ages 6 to 18 who have been impacted by a parent's cancer.



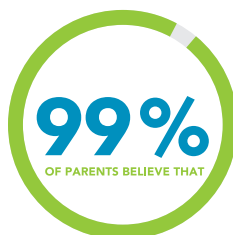

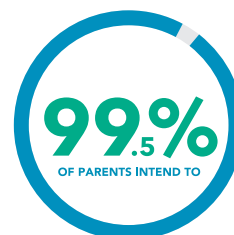
